# **EXTREME WEATHER PROCEDURES**

Last week saw extreme wet weather hit our region resulting in rising rivers and creeks, local roads being cut and bus services cancelled. This is often a very challenging time for schools as we make every effort to ensure that children can travel home safely. Please help us to plan for future extreme weather events by;

- having up to date emergency contacts. If you live out of town please give consideration to having at least one
  emergency contact that lives in town, if possible. This means if roads are cut off quickly children have a place
  to go to.
- keeping up to date on our Skoolbag app and Facebook page for information on bus cancellations and early departures.
- keeping up to date on weather alerts and traffic information via appropriate websites such as

- informing the school early if you are coming to pick up your child/children. It is not always possible to get a
  message to children at the end of the school day, particularly in an extreme weather event.
  If you are in any doubt about being able to get home safely please come to school and collect your
  child/children as soon as possible.

# STAYING HEALTHY AT SCHOOL

For various reasons children can have a lower immunity level and cannot fight infections in the same way as other children or adults (immunosuppressed). This can be because they have recently had a virus, an infectious disease or because they have been treated for a life threatening disease such as leukaemia or cancer. It is very important that the school is notified immediately if any child has been diagnosed with infectious diseases such as chicken pox, shingles, measles, whopping cough etc. For a child who is immunosuppressed it is vitally important that they be given the opportunity to take medicine that can lessen their chance of further infection. The following is general advice on stopping the spread of germs at school which can be applied to colds, flus and infectious diseases;

# Keep children at home when they are sick.

If possible keep your child away from school when they are sick. This will help prevent spreading illness to others. See a doctor immediately if you suspect your child has chicken pox, shingles, measles, whopping cough or other contagious diseases.

## Avoid close contact.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

#### Cover your mouth and nose.

Encourage children to cover their mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing or cough or sneeze into their upper arm. It may prevent others from getting sick.

## Clean your hands.

Washing hands often will help protect children from germs.

If your child is too sick to be at school, please keep them at home to rest. This may prevent others from becoming ill and helps us to ensure our children are happy and healthy at school. We appreciate your cooperation in this area.

#### **2020 SWIMMING CARNIVAL**

Attendance may have been down due to the torrential rain felt across the region last week but participation was at an all time high at this year's Casino Public School annual swimming carnival. The colour beaming from the stands and the chants sung (or should I say screamed!) from the sidelines were a credit to the students from all houses. Captains and Vice Captains helped guide their houses and they should be commended for their leadership. Because of the tremendous participation from all houses the final tally of points became very close. Whether it was across the pool, novelties or zone qualifying events, all participation and place points were collated by Mrs Dollisson and helped form the close result on the day, with only 103 points separating 1st from 4th. Congratulations to Paterson who took out the carnival on the day with 351 points! Second place was Lawson on 296, third was Gordon with 261 and fourth was Kendall with 248 points.

12 records were broken this year including Jamyson Ellis (who broke 5 individual records and was a part of the record breaking relay team). Jamyson broke the Junior boys 200m Individual Medley, 10yrs 50m Freestyle, Junior 50m Boys Breaststroke, Junior Boys 50m Backstroke and Junior Boys 50m Butterfly. Campbell Hill AWD broke the 50m 11yrs Boys Backstroke and Freestyle record, Hope Moss AWD broke the 50m 11yrs Girls Backstroke and Freestyle record and Buddy Hampson broke the 11yrs Boys 50m Backstroke and Freestyle record. The Lawson Junior Boys Relay Team (consisting of Bayden Parker, Jamyson Ellis, Cohen Dietrich and Harley Milton) also broke a record in the 4 x 50m Freestyle Junior Boys Relay by almost 30 seconds! Some of these records had been held since the year 2003!
